The benefits of using Monitor\kiosk include:

- Top up students print money account on-line at home
- Receipts issued (by e-mail through on-line or printed from machine)
- · Transactions are up loaded daily to the KAMAR student account
- Ability to pay via credit card on-line (convenience of not having to come to the college to pay your account)
- · Ability to select and pay on-line is more secure than sending cash/cheques
- Top up student ID cards used to pay for products at the canteen

MOI-DELAWARE Impact Challenge is designed for college

Teams will be formed from 3-4 like-minded/skilled persons that can utilize SCRATCH, PHASER, or UNREAL ENGINE to design their game. Challenge participants will be mentored by 25 computer teachers from the University of Delaware.
