### Advice to schools and ECECs from Public Health regarding current Air Quality Nelson / Tasman Region

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**Pigeon Valley Fire** 

8 February 2019 1130 hours

The following should be considered in any decision-making on the public health risk around air quality:

- How close is the school or ECEC to the nearest part of the fire? Obviously, if a school is close to the fire
  front, then sensible decisions must be made about the personal safety of pupils and staff. If in doubt,
  the school or ECEC should close.
- 2. Currently a lot of smoke is present from the Wakefield/Appleby/Mapua areas through to Nelson city. Staff and pupils with asthma, bronchitis, emphysema or other lung disease are at greater risk from smoke inhalation, as smoke can irritate the airways and provoke an attack. Those with angina or other heart disease might also be more affected. While smoke persists:
  - keep staff and students indoors (walking classroom to classroom is fine)
  - avoid outside play
  - cancel school sports
  - close all the windows and doors
  - · turn off ventilation, air conditioning and heating systems that draw in air from outside

If any people with the above conditions start to develop symptoms, they should use the medicines prescribed to them by their doctor. If their symptoms do not subside, they should be removed to a place away from the school that is free of smoke, and remain there until school ends. If symptoms continue to worsen, call Healthline on 0800 611 116

Ultimately, the greatest risk is to those in the path of the fire, who must follow the directions of the Emergency Services for their immediate safety. This includes schools and early childhood services.

The air quality will continue to change depending on wind speed and direction. It is suggested that someone at the school monitor online Civil Defence updates, and media newsfeeds.


