Attendance - Every Day Matters

We are continuing to focus on raising student attendance this term.

To date this year, across Terms One, Two and Three, Garin College maintains an overall average Regular Attendance Rate of 55.6% (students attending 90–100%). We acknowledge and thank these students and their parents for their commitment and diligence in maintaining this level of attendance.

We also wish to thank the students and whānau who work closely with our Pastoral Care and Student Services teams to develop strategies where significant challenges impact their child's attendance.

However, we continue to evidence unjustified student absenteeism within all year levels 9 - 13., that includes truancy and family holidays taken during term time.

If you are experiencing difficulty in getting your child to school, please do speak to us! You may contact your child's Whānau Teacher, Year level Dean or a member of our Senior Leadership Team. We are committed to encouraging and supporting all students to attend school regularly and building a culture that celebrates excellence attendance.

Arriving for the School Day

Garin College school day starts at 8.40am. Learners are required to be at school by **8.35am** ready for the first bell at this time.

- If a learner is late to school or arrives during the school day, they must report to the school office to sign in, they are required to have a valid reason for their lateness, a supporting note from a parent or caregiver is appreciated.

Absences

Our timely and accurate recording of learners' attendance is essential.

- If a learner is going to be absent, parents are required to phone the school office and leave a detailed message on the phone, including the learner's name, whanau class and reason for absence.
- Parents wishing to take a learner out of school for non school events e.g. holiday - you must communicate your intentions by email for the attention of the Principal. Such approved absence may be deemed explained, however unjustified.

Messages for students during the day

Thank you to parents and whānau for respecting the Phone Away for the Day policy and not contacting your student via phone during the school day. Please consider the following modes of communication with your children:

- As a BYOD school, students regularly use their laptop throughout the day, **email your child with a message**
- **Send a TEXT message or email** that your child may read on their phone before school starts and after school ends
- Make arrangements with your child before that school day - your child could call, **TEXT or email after school**

Urgent / crisis communications - where there is a need to contact the office to relay an **urgent** message or if there is a crisis that needs immediate attention, **please do contact the School Office**; when we are made aware of such a situation, this will be treated in confidence and managed carefully and professionally.

Summer Uniform

At Garin College we value our learners' appearance and for them to take pride in their uniform. If for any reason your learner is unable to wear part of their correct uniform then they will require a day pass issued by their Whānau teacher. Parents are encouraged to support their learner by providing a note when your learner does not have the correct uniform.

Summer uniforms may be worn in term 4. The Senior Blazer is optional in Summer, apart from formal assembly, mass and other formal occasions.

For all formal occasions at school, including our end of Year Mass, Club Garin Colours and annual Prize Giving, senior students are required to wear their formal school uniform (Winter uniform) at these events and Juniors are required to be in full and tidy uniform.

A black puffer jacket is only acceptable to be worn to and from school and at morning tea or lunch, but not in classrooms.

Non-uniform items, for example; sweatshirts, hoodies caps and excess jewellery are not part of the uniform, learners are not to arrive at school wearing such items. [Garin College Uniform](#)
